

## **BARBER PHYSICAL ACTIVITY CENTER - REC TRAC AND ENTRY POLICY -**

All patrons must present proper identification to enter Barber Physical Activity Center. This does not include active duty in uniform. Patrons are required to present their ID to the Rec Attendant at the Customer Service Desk and log in their status on the punch screens located at the front desk. When eligible personnel use a Semper Fit Recreational Facility, information is stored in the computer and used to track patron usage.

This process is essential to justify future funding for programs, personnel and facilities.

### **Eligibility in order of priority:**

- ◆ Armed Forces and their family members to include: Members on Active Duty, members of the Reserve Components (Ready reserve and National Guard; Reservists in Training or hospitalized; Inactive Reserves) Delayed entry personnel. Cadets of Service Academies. Members of the Coast Guard.
- ◆ Other uniformed Services and their families to include Commissioned Corps of the Public Health Service and Commissioned Corps of the national Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NCOAA) on Active Duty.
- ◆ Armed Forces and other uniformed service retirees and their families to include: Retired from Active Duty; Retired from the Reserves with pay and Retired without pay.
- ◆ Others separated from the Armed Forces and their families to include: Honorably discharged veterans with 100 percent Service-connected disability and involuntarily separated service members under the Transition Assistance Management Program. Personnel separated under the Voluntary Separation Incentive (VSI) and Special Separation Benefit (SSB) Programs for two years after separation; Medal of Honor Recipients.
- ◆ Former and/or surviving spouses and family members to include: Unremarried surviving spouses of personnel who died while on Active Duty or Retired status; Unremarried former spouses who were married to military members for at least 20 years while the military member was on Active Duty to the Armed Forces. Orphans of military members, when not adopted age 21 (or over if they are incapable of supporting themselves, time study.)
- ◆ Other supporters of DoD to include medical personnel under component during periods when they are residing on the installation.
- ◆ US DoD civilians and family members, when accompanied, to include: Both APF and NAF civilians, Department of Justice (DoJ) personnel assigned to Quantico. Immediate family members of these civilians may use facilities when accompanied by their sponsor. Civilians may participate in the intramural program. Civilians may not participate in any sport above the



intramural level. Civilians enrolled in the Semper Fit program who have paid the advertised fees may attend lunch time classes on a space-available basis. Civilians may not use programs or activities when there exists authorized patrons of a higher priority available on a waiting list to use the same program or activity.

- ◆ Other associated with the Department of Defense, to include Reserve Officers' Training Corp cadets when participating in field training.

## Guest Policy

Authorized patrons at least age 18 and older may sponsor and sign in a maximum of two bona fide guests. A bona fide guest is someone who is visiting an Active Duty or Retired military member for an extended period of time, or an immediate family member of a DoD civilian (appropriated and nonappropriated fund), working aboard Marine Corps Base, Quantico. Active Duty military personnel and their family members at least age 18 are authorized to sponsor Active/Retired military family members between the ages of 12 and 15, who possess military dependent ID cards and must comply with age policy restrictions. The sponsor must accompany, supervise and participate in the same event as the guest at all times. Under no circumstances will the sponsor leave the guest unattended. Solicitation by unauthorized patrons is not allowed. The guest and sponsor must sign and abide by the sponsor sign in sheet (release and hold harmless agreement) at the front customer service desk.

### Youth Policy

Youth ages sixteen (16) and above are authorized independent (self-directed) use of the Barber Physical Activity Center. Youth ages twelve (12) to fifteen (15) are authorized use only with direct supervision by a parent or legal guardian. Youth under the ages of twelve (12) are not authorized in the Physical Activity Center unless a member of the Semper Fit Co-op program or participating in an MCCA youth sponsored event. Youth may accompany their parents or legal guardians to watch a scheduled MCCA game or event but must remain with their sponsor in the bleachers at all times.

1. Age 11 and under. Children ages 11 and younger are not allowed in the Barber Physical Activity Center due to the inherent risks and dangers of unsupervised use of fitness facilities.
2. Ages 12 to 15. Youth, ages 12 to 15, are authorized use of the equipment in the Fitness Deck when accompanied and under the direct supervision of a parent or legal guardian ages 18 or older. The Physical Fitness staff will monitor this usage.
3. Ages 16 to 17. Youth, ages 16 to 17, are authorized to participate in self-directed cardiovascular/weight training activities and participate in-group exercise activities, provided they have received instruction on the proper use of equipment and performance technique by a certified fitness instructor. Youth ages 16-17 are permitted full use of all fitness areas and Physical Activity Center.
4. DIRECT SUPERVISION. Direct supervision is defined as:
  - 4.1. The sole responsibility of the parent or legal guardian to supervise and care for the child.
  - 4.2. The adult cannot leave the child unattended anywhere in the Barber Physical Activity Center. Parents may not leave their children alone in the bleachers, lobby, etc. while they participate in basketball, volleyball or any other activity.
  - 4.3. The adult cannot participate in any event that does not directly involve the child.
  - 4.4. During weight training activities, the parent or legal guardian is required to act as the child's workout partner/"spotter" for children ages 12-15
