

YOUR QUESTIONS, ANSWERED

Q: Who is required to enroll into EFMP?

A: EFMP is a mandatory enrollment program, per MCO 1754.4. Dependent family members enrolled in DEERS (spouse, child, adopted child, step child, foster child, or a dependent parent) who reside with the sponsor and have a qualifying condition that is either medical, mental health, or a special education need.

Q: What is a qualifying condition?

A: A qualifying condition is when a dependent is seeing a specialist on a regular basis or a child is receiving special education services. There is no set list of qualifying conditions. Some examples are cancer, asthma, allergies, heart conditions, thyroid conditions, deafness, blindness, cerebral palsy, autism, ADD, ADHD, depression, bipolar disorder, an Individualized Education Plan (IEP), or Individualized Family Service Plan (IFSP).

Q: How do I enroll into EFMP?

A: Enrollment forms can be picked up at the EFMP office or downloaded from the EFMP website. The DD 2792 Medical Summary form is required for all dependents, whether or not there is a physical condition present. This form is completed by the physician. Any physician, military or civilian, can fill out the DD 2792. The DD 2792-1 Special Education Summary is required for all children receiving special education services or accommodations in the school or early intervention services. Such examples of these special education services are an IEP (Individualized Education Plan), Individualized Family Service Plan (IFSP), or a 504 Accommodation Plan. When completed, return the forms to the Quantico EFMP office for processing. EFMP Headquarters will make the eligibility determination. You will receive a notification email from HQ EFMP stating acceptance or denial into the EFMP. Once enrolled, it is the family's responsibility to have those same forms updated every 3 years or when there is a major change in the condition.

Q: My family was identified as potentially being eligible for EFMP in the Overseas Screening / Suitability Screening process. Now what?

A: Suitability Screening is a separate process from EFMP. However, at this crucial time that your family's medical records are being evaluated, an EFMP qualifying condition may be recognized. If so, follow the directions to apply for the EFMP. EFMP Headquarters will make a determination about enrolling your family into the EFMP. The suitability screening process cannot continue until an EFMP determination is made.

Q: How can the Family Case Worker assist my family?

A: Every EFMP family is assigned a Family Case Worker as one direct point of contact. The Family Case Worker can act as a navigator directing the family toward installation and community resources. Some areas that the Family Case Worker can offer guidance on are: Tricare Echo, priority housing, respite care, support groups, support at IEP meetings, resources, and referrals. The Family Case Worker offers resource and referral in order to empower the family to be their own best advocate.

Q: What is respite care?

A: The respite care program allows a qualified provider of the family's choosing to come into the home to care for the exceptional family member and allow the family to de-stress and have a break. Some EFMP families may be eligible to be reimbursed an authorized amount of funds for up to 20 hours of care per month. The family can contact their family case worker to find out if they are eligible for the Respite Care Program.

Q: How can my family be involved and stay active with EFMP Quantico?

A: EFMP Quantico hosts many family events throughout the year such as Swim Safety, Bowling, Ice Cream Social, Make & Take Crafts, the Holiday Event, and more! There are also educational trainings such as Special Education Boot Camp and Morning Coffee with guest speakers. The Quarterly Town Hall and Military Committee for Persons with Disabilities Committee (MCPD) offer families a time to interact with various base agencies that interact with EFMP families. No experience is necessary, just a desire to be involved.

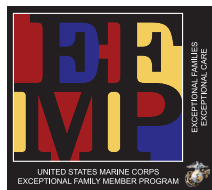
